As a Board we would like to take this opportunity to let you know what has been happening at the governance level for Waiau. We have a new staff representative on the Board – Jasmine Quinn and in December last year Rachael Poole was co-opted onto the Board. Amanda Baldwin has remained as the student representative, Dwayne Unahi and Honorlea Mangion are co chairing and Phil Erskine and Graeme Parsons complete the Board. We would like to say a huge thank you to Leeanne de Vries who was appointed by the Ministry of Education back in August 2014 as a Specialist Advisor. Leeanne has provided ongoing support to the Board as we transitioned from a Commissioner back to Self Governance. You have provided the current board with the tools and knowledge to perform the governance roles and responsibilities to monitor student achievement and strive for continued improvement in this area.

We are also excited to let you know that we are part of a joint pilot approach that is supported by both the Ministry of Education and the Education Review Office and through this initiative a comprehensive action plan has been developed with clear goals and identified time frames.

We would like to remind you that at the heart of all decisions that we as a board make is to ensure that every one of our students is achieving to the best of their potential.

We are now required by legislation to publish our annual accounts on our website so from the end of May you will be able to find these on the school website.
